

## Residential Swimming Pool Safety Act Requirements of Section 515.21 Florida Statute

The Florida Building Code and Section 515.21 Florida Statute requires pools to be enclosed by a barrier meeting the requirements of Chapter 41, Florida Building Code, Residential

## Please indicate <u>all</u> of your methods of compliance with Section R4101.17 FBC, Residential.

- □ An enclosure (screen) that meets the pool barrier requirements.
- □ Fencing that meets the pool barrier requirements.
- $\Box$  All doors and windows providing direct access from the house to the pool will be equipped with an exit alarm that meets the requirements of UL 2017.
- □ All doors and gates providing direct access to the pool will be equipped with a self-closing, selflatching device with a release mechanism placed no lower than 54 inches above the floor/ground. All gates will be out swinging.
- $\Box$  Removable child-barrier fencing.
- □ The pool will be equipped with an approved safety pool cover.
- □ A flip-up style ladder in association with an above-ground pool meeting the minimum 48" height barrier requirement.

According to Section 515.27 F.S., a person who fails to <u>equip and maintain</u> a new residential swimming pool with required pool safety features commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

Inspection access to the interior of the house is required if alarms on windows & doors are used to meet the above requirements.
