MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR



Happy New Year!!! I know I speak for many, but I am really glad that 2021 is here and 2020 is now behind us. As I write this, the new vaccine is being distributed and will soon be available. Although 2020 was an unusual year, with twists, turns, masks, social distancing, and the pandemic that claimed so many, it was also productive from a City standpoint. We accomplished many goals during 2020.

We obtained final FEMA reimbursements from Hurricane Irma for repairs to Riverfront Park, completed the Windle Lane Stormwater Pond to reduce flooding in the Coventry Forest Subdivision, installed the Courts at Riverfront pickleball courts, and approved 141 Small Business Grants through County administered COVID-19 CARES Act funding. We finished the year with the City being in a much better financial position, thanks to the hard work of the City Manager and the Finance Department.

As we begin the new year, we are still practicing safe

distancing and continue broadcasting City Council meetings via Facebook Live. And while we were not able to have many traditional holiday events last year, the City still held a drive-through holiday event that was very well received and attended, thanks to our Parks Department. I must applaud all our City staff as they can continue to provide services and events in a safe and thoughtful manner. Thanks to our Police Chief we held 4 "Coffee with a COP" and chat with the Mayor events via Facebook. The Police Department continues to post notices on Twitter and Facebook to keep our residents up to date. Please follow those outlets to stay informed on all City matters and events.

The Fire Department ushered in a big red beautiful fire truck. Our Public Works department finished several projects and said farewell to a retiree with 43 years of service (best wishes Pat Clark).

Our Community Development Department and Redevelopment Director continue working hard, with new construction along the south end of US1.

In fact, a recent survey showed that 97% of the families found the dual approach was highly effective with many stating the fact that WCA teachers and administration communicated clearly and continually throughout.

To reduce stormwater runoff and improve water quality, you can...

- Sweep sidewalks and driveways instead of using the hose
- Never dump anything down storm drains
- Avoid pesticides
- Clean up after your pet
- Wash your car at a car wash or on the grass
- Use rain barrels
- Pick up trash and keep drains and gutters clean
- Check your cars for oil leaks and recycle oil
- Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces
