The State of Florida Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has opened applications for FEMA-4486-DR-FL COVID-19 Pandemic. Hazard Mitigation Grant funds are to be used for projects that will reduce or eliminate losses from future natural and man-made disasters. Funds must be used to provide a long-term solution to a problem such as flooding, wind damage etc. The City of South Daytona's application will request \$420,000 to acquire and install a 250 kw Caterpillar Generator at the City's Municipal Complex. The Generator will replace the current system and will provide power to the entire complex which includes City Hall, Police Department and Fire Department. Under the program. FEMA will contribute up to 75 percent (\$315,000) of the total amount approved with the City funding the remaining 25 percent (\$105,000) non-federal share. This project has been selected second on the Volusia County Priority List and has received a letter of endorsement from the Volusia County LMS Chair.

Staff recommends approval of Resolution No. 2021-34, authorizing submittal of an application to the State of Florida Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) and authorizing acceptance and execution of the grant, if awarded.

WHEREAS, the City of South Daytona desires to apply for a Hazard Mitigation Grant through the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Emergency Management in partnership with the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH DAYTONA, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1.</u> The City Council of South Daytona hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute and submit all documents relating to the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, including but not limited to all documents relating to submittal of an application, and acceptance and execution of a grant agreement, if awarded.

**Section 5.** That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
