MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR



It's Summer!! Of course, that also means we are now in Hurricane Season. Review your plans, check your supplies, and stay alert. Make sure you have a 3-day supply of food, water, and medications. Have your generator maintained and be careful storing extra fuel in containers. Remember to include an evacuation plan for you and your pets too.

This summer, the Piggotte Community Center will be undergoing much needed renovations. The improved community center will be a welcome upgrade for those utilizing this facility for community meetings, social activities, and weddings.

Our summer soccer program is in full swing and we look forward to the kick-off of our fall sports programs and City special events that will be scheduled in our beautiful parks.

On June 10, the South Daytona Daytona Beach Shores annual fishing tournament was held at Sun Glow Pier in Daytona Beach Shores. Vice-Mayor Doug Quartier, Councilman Eric Sander, City Manager Les Gillis along with staff were there to

assist the children with baiting hooks, weighing fish and providing guidance. The event was well attended and the kids had a great time.

Upcoming special events include Night Out Against Crime on August 2nd. Also, a Back-to-School Event will be held on August 6th at 10:00 a.m. at the Piggotte Community Center. Public Works continues work on relining our sewer lines throughout the city. By relining the sewer pipes, groundwater is prevented from entering the sewer lines. A recent afternoon rain proved this process is working. During the storm we pumped a significant amount less from our sewer line experiencing a savings of approximately \$1,200.

HELPFUL HINTS TO PREPARE NOW:

- Locate Emergency Supplies: include medication, disinfectant supplies, and pet supplies.
 - Only take the items you and your family may need so that others who rely on these products can also access them.
- Form an Evacuation Plan for yourself and your pets.
- Make sure your insurance policies and personal documents like ID are up to date. Make copies and keep them in a secure password protected digital space.
- Trim trees, clean drains and gutters, bring in outside furniture, consider hurricane shutters.
- Keep your cell phone charged when you know a hurricane is in the forecast and purchase backup charging devices to power electronics.
- Gas in vehicle. Cash on hand.

Want to receive alerts from the City? Be sure you sign up today for the South Daytona Connect Program. This system will be used to notify you about weather alerts, public safety notifications, health notifications, and more. This emergency notification system allows you to receive communication from the City through a phone call, text message, or e-mail based on your preferences. You pick where, you pick how.

Golf Carts



Did you know South Daytona is a golf cart friendly community?

The City of South Daytona Golf Cart Program allows the use of golf carts on selected City streets. To use this program you just need to register your golf cart with the South Daytona Police Department (1672 S. Ridgewood Avenue).

Your golf cart must have the following:

- efficient brakes
- brake lights
- reliable steering
- safe tires
- rearview mirror
- two headlights
- red reflectorized warning devices in the front and rear
- front and rear turn signals
- windshield

Citizen Patrol

My fellow South Daytona residents, it is definitely summertime. And has been for a couple of months it seems. One of the big problems that occur during the hotter months of the year are heat related health problems.

The Fire Department, Police Department and Ambulance Paramedics answer a lot of calls for Heat Strokes. Heat Stroke is the most serious form of heat injury and is considered a medical emergency. If you suspect someone has heat stroke, also known as sunstroke, call 9-1-1 immediately and render first aid until Paramedics arrive. With the heat and humidity so high, it does not take long for the body to overheat. Don't stay out in the heat for too long and stay hydrated. Drink, drink, drink. If you start experiencing heat cramps, fainting or heat exhaustion, get in the air conditioning and cool down.

Heat stroke can kill or cause damage to the brain and other internal organs. Although heat stroke mainly affects people over the age of 50, it can also affect healthy young athletes. We all want to make it through the summer alive and well.

South Daytona Historical Society

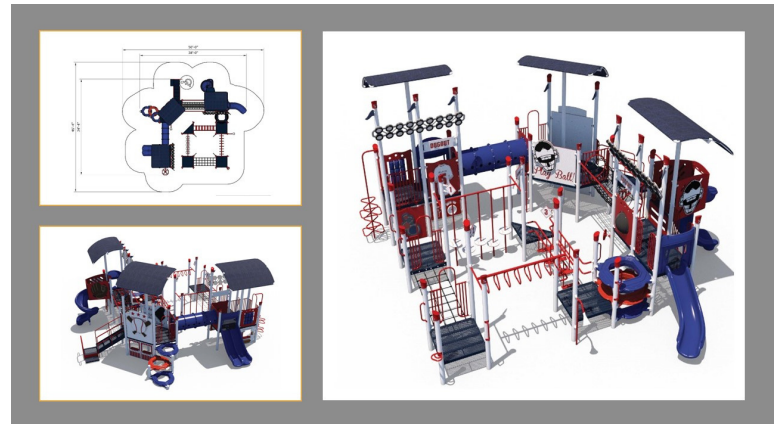

Utility Billing

Water Meter Box Maintenance

Leaks and other water emergencies can become disastrous when a meter box is not accessible or hard to locate due to debris, structural obstructions, or vegetation overgrowth. Help us provide great service by ensuring our Meter Technicians have safe access to your water meter.

Here are some things to consider:

- A direct path to your meter box is needed, free of obstructions, overgrown grass, bushes, garden boxes, and other structures or ground coverings.
- The meter box should be easy to access.
- Make sure your pets are secured. Keeping pets safely inside protects them as well as our Meter Technicians.
- If your meter box is located within a locked area of your property, please contact our office to learn about providing access while maintaining security for your property.

If you have questions on how to locate your meter box, please call our office for assistance.

- Obey the traffic laws, signals and speed limits.



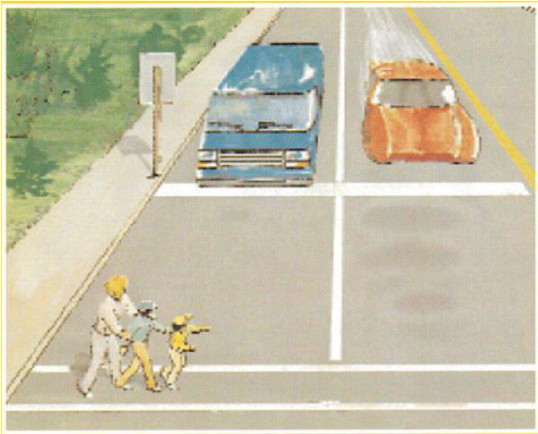

Coming to a complete stop at the stop line.

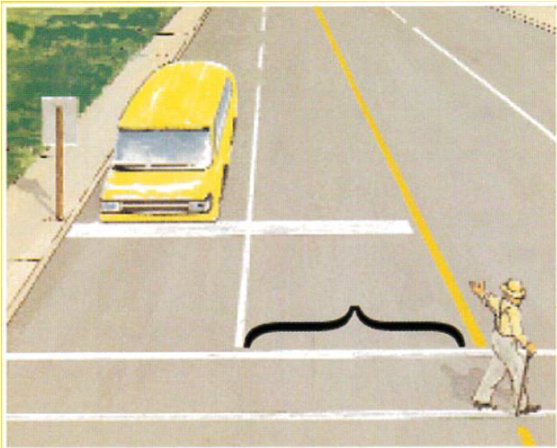
Never passing stopped vehicles at a stop.



Waiting until the walker/biker has crossed at least one lane beyond yours before proceeding.

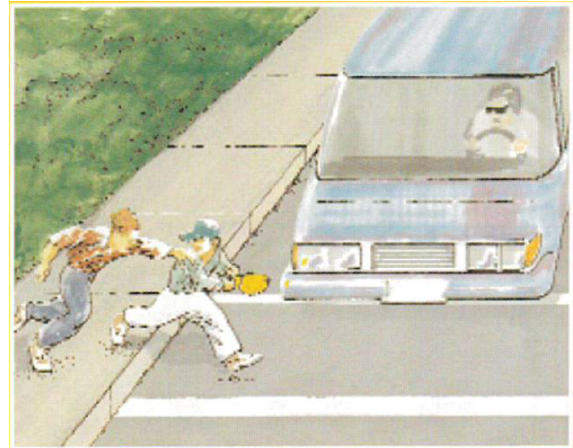


Being alert for children.

The South Daytona Citizens Alert, South Daytona Lions Club, and South Daytona Police Department are hosting the 14th Annual Kailynne Quartier Memorial Ride, Saturday, September 17, 2022. All types of vehicles are welcome.

Kailynne Quartier, a beautiful 13-year-old, lost her heroic battle with brain cancer on July 16, 2007. Kailynne was the daughter of Retired Captain Doug Quartier, a 35-year veteran of our Police Department.

Citizens Alert is sponsoring this Memorial Ride as a fundraising event with the proceeds benefitting numerous local charities, programs, and foundations.
