## MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR



Summer is over and soon the busy holiday season will be upon us. With caution and approved safety precautions the City is moving forward and planning many exciting special events. More to follow.

The City is expecting to receive funding through the American Rescue Plan Act. Plans for those funds are to

"invest in us," by improving our aging infrastructure throughout the City addressing the most pressing concerns first.

The City Council, our City Manager and staff have worked very hard to put together a budget for next year. As presented, I am happy to report that during my term as Mayor, between 2016 and 2021, City debt has been decreased by \$12,982,588. My promise to reduce debt is being realized. The City Council has continued to work hard to put our City on firm financial standing.

The Blaine O'Neal Memorial Golf Tournament will be held on Saturday, October 16, 2021, at Cypress Head. Proceeds from this event benefit many programs established as part of the South Daytona Community Trust. The Trust is a non-profit organization that provides financial assistance to

residents of South Daytona. The tournament is named in memory of Blaine O'Neal who served as our Mayor, for five years before his sudden passing in 2010. In memory of his commitment to the City, we host the 16th Annual Blaine O'Neal Memorial Golf Tournament. If you are interest in playing, sponsoring, or donating, please contact the Parks and Recreation Office.

The Parks Department is planning activities for the fall including a Trick or Treat Drive-Thru Boo on October 29th, Barbeque and Bluegrass Festival on November 20th, and family friendly Christmas events. Please visit our City website and Facebook page for times and location for these and other events.

This year has been full of new development with construction. The Enclave at 3230 luxury apartments were completed in March of 2021 and are now over 98% occupied. The City Council also approved a 330-unit luxury riverfront apartment complex with a 145-slip marina and restaurant with views of the Halifax River in April. Construction is planned for next summer. This and other development in the City promise to bring new commercial and retail business opportunities along U.S.1.



## **Code Enforcement**



## **Common Code Violations**

#### 1. YARD MAINTENANCE STANDARDS

Maintenance of yards and rights-of-way abutting property are the responsibility of the property owner. The right-of-way must be free of obstructions caused by trees, vegetation, or other objects.

#### 2. INOPERATIVE MOTOR VEHICLES

Inoperative vehicles are not permitted. A vehicle is considered inoperable if a current tag is not displayed and/ or it is not fully equipped to legally and safely operate on public streets.

#### 3. JUNK, TRASH AND DEBRIS

Junk, auto parts, furniture, trash, tires, building materials, tree trimmings, and any other debris cannot be left in the yard and must be properly disposed of.

#### 4. PARKING

Parking is permitted for passenger vehicles and motorcycles in residential properties only on a hard surfaced driveway, carport, garage or parkage (where applicable).

#### 5. COMMERCIAL EQUIPMENT

Commercial equipment and vehicles cannot be parked or stored in a residential area.

6. **MAINTENANCE OF EXTERIOR STRUCTURES** Exterior building structures and walls shall be maintained in a secure and attractive manner.

#### 7. CONDITION OF STRUCTURES

Any wood, siding, shingles, roof covering, railings, fences, walls, ceilings, porches, doors, windows, screens, and other exterior parts of a structure must be maintained in weather tight, rodent proof, sound condition and in good repair.

#### 8. OUTDOOR STORAGE

Outdoor storage is prohibited. You may not keep indoor furniture, household appliances, auto parts, building materials, or any other similar items outside.

#### 9. PERMIT REQUIRED

Properties that include additions or alterations to interior/exterior of a structure require permit(s) and/or inspections of approval.

#### 10. PROHIBITED BUSINESSES

Engaging in a business requires a Business Tax Receipt and zoning approval.

#### **Targeted Businesses**

\* Financial, medical, professional offices \* Food-related businesses including sit-down restaurants, coffee shops, and grocery stores \*High-tech manufacturing, such as, aerospace or computer technology \* Ecotourism, marine or sports related businesses \* Corporate headquarters.

#### Incentives

Grants up to \$50,000 for new construction, up to \$25,000 for substantial renovations, up to \$15,000 for site improvements, fees and setback waivers.

## **Citizens Patrol**

The South Daytona Citizens Patrol is an all volunteer organization. You have seen our team members working traffic and parking cars at special events, primarily at Reed Canal Park.

The S.D.C.P. Team members also patrol the streets on a regular basis looking for anything out of the ordinary and notify the Police Officers so that they can respond.

One of our primary functions is to relieve Police Officers on traffic posts related to motor vehicles accidents / crashes. S.D.C.P. Members have been called out at different times to assist.

Two of the Members responded to a crash late one night where a car mowed down a fire hydrant. That resulted in the underground water main for the entire area being sheared off and flooding the street. The Members blocked off traffic on either end of the crash site so the Police Officers could resume their duties. The South Daytona Public Works Department spent the next four (4) hours digging up the water main and splicing the water line to restore service. The S.D.C.P. Members were there until the street could safely be opened for vehicular traffic.

When you see S.D.C.P. Members working a traffic crash / detour like described above, please be patient. The Police Officers that originally responded to the scene set up the traffic pattern / detour. We just take the Police Officers place to continue what they had already established. If you need to get to a business or residence just past the roadblock, just stop, roll down your window and ask us. If we can possibly accommodate getting you there, we will. We may have to direct you to the other end of the detour to come in from that way but we will do our best.

Remember, we're volunteers trying to help our fellow citizens. Be kind.


